- Persons with manual settings cameras.

All interested persons reaching above criteria, coming from the chosen countries, are eligible to apply for the Workshop. The procedure requires sending filled-in Learner application form to Workshop's Organizer.

Under the title “Into the wild – with photographic lens” we are organizing a photography Workshop for senior learners from other countries, combined with familiarize with unique polish nature, hidden in Wielkopolska National Park. Participants will discover beauty of wild through photographic lens, under attentive care of professional photographer and qualified forest guide.

Workshop's themes:

- Photography equipment
- Basic setting and functions
- Open space photography
- Landscape photography
- Photographing moving objects
- Interior photography*
- Portraits*

* Optionally - in case there will be no good weather for workshop in a forest.

During 5 days of outdoor activities seniors will develop their skills in photography art, and in the evenings – they will take part in events helping them know each other closer (sightseeing trip to the heart of Wielkopolska – Poznan).

We provide:

- training materials,
- transport during the Workshop,
- Coordinator's help and care.

The Workshop is open to any adult citizen who is a national of or permanently residing (or registered as refugee or asylum-seeker) in one of the Programme countries, namely: the 27 Member States of the European Union, Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway (EFTA-EEA countries) and Turkey (candidate country).
